

# High School vs Junior High

- Courses are mostly semestered (Sept-Jan and Feb-June) \*some exceptions
- 4 classes per day (87 minutes each)
- Grades are in percentages
- You need to pass courses to get credits (a minimum pass is 50% but there are specific recommendations for course sequences, and teachers will share their course recommendations with families)
- Correct academic & option placement is important!
- Teachers have tutorial times available each day and some departments have help rooms

#### **Alberta High School Diploma Requirements**

- 100 Credits
- English Language Arts 30 level
- Social Studies 30 level
- Mathematics 20 level
- Science 20 level
- Physical Education 10
- Career and Life Management (CALM)
- 10 credits from Second Languages, CTS, Fine Arts, Locally Developed Courses, PE 20/30, and/or RAP.
- 10 credits in any 30-level course (in addition to Social and English)

Courses are generally 5 credits Minimum pass 50%, student should have 65%+ to maintain current sequence (course dependent)

*10 level = grade 10* 

*20 level = grade 11* 

*30 level = grade 12* 

### What stream is best for students?




**AP Streams** – Excellent academic achievement, strong test performance, work ethic, and interest in subject, highly motivated and able to handle additional workload (AP-cohorted classes)


"Dash one" - Strong past performance, strong reading/writing skills, independent worker, good organizational skills, maintains a regular homework schedule (ELA 10-1, SS 10-1, Math 15/10C, Science 10)

"Dash two" - Satisfactory performance, more comfortable with concrete concepts/examples, prefers to complete work in class, working on strengthening skills in reading, writing, math or organization (ELA 10-2, SS 10-2, Math 10-3, Science 14)







- What is AP?
  - Classes that enrich the breadth and depth of the regular program
  - Ends in an internationally standardized exam (written in grade 12 or grade 11)
  - A high grade on the exam can earn credits for university

- Because you are interested in earning post-secondary credits
